Majors' musings...

I was sharing at Bible Study the other day about the 'signpost' put on my spiritual journey when I had the privilege of listening to the

Rev. Yonggi Cho from South Korea preach on prayer. But when we venture into the realms of prayer we very quickly come across the big problem of prayer: Why is it that prayers are not answered? After all, there are many, many promises that would seem to say that if we ask anything in Jesus' name that we will receive it. Why are prayers that seem so good to make so often not answered in the way that we would answer them if we were God? And that is the point, rather than the prayers not being answered.

You see prayers, are not always answered with an affirmative, and God does not always align the planets to fit in with our will. Sometimes we ask for things, and we do not think through the consequences of what we are asking for. Sometimes we ask for things, and we have not asked God what his will is. Sometimes we ask for things, and they will just not be good for us. Sometimes we ask for things, and our lives are so off-kilter with God that he deliberately refuses that request until we have amended our ways. Sometimes we ask for things, and we have to be prepared for a negative from the Lord and yet still maintain that trust in him, because at the end of the day, he is, he was, and always will be, God. And sometimes we just haven't got a clue as to why the Lord should turn down our prayers. But we still ask.

For prayer is like a little child coming to a father and telling him about their day, telling him about their concerns, and asking for help over different issues. I encourage you at some point over this holy season to look closely at the prayers of Jesus during those days. There are quite a few, including prayers from the cross, where he prays with his last breath 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit!' That, incidentally, is a prayer that each Hebrew child prayed before going to sleep at night. Praying like a child... a simple prayer, but an effective prayer of confidence in our Father in Heaven. And that is why we continue to ask. We ask because he is our loving heavenly father who cares for us, who loves us so much that he will hear us when we pray, he will listen to us, and when the moment is right, he will act. I cannot answer for him when our prayers are not answered, but I know that I'll still keep on asking him, and I hope you will too.

Easter blessings to you all. He is risen! Hallelujah!
